Steaming ahead four positions to No. 12 this year, Viking Yacht has continued expansion plans that began in 2002 with the purchase of the 32-acre Bass River Marina. Renamed the Viking Yachting Center, it has 270 slips and serves as a marina and repair facility.

In 2003, Viking formed Atlantic Marine Electronics to install electronics on the new Viking yachts at the center. The Yachting Center also is home to the northern division of Palm Beach Towers, another Viking company created in 2003 to build tuna towers and other aluminum fabrication for Viking Yachts.

Viking Yacht Co. was founded in 1964 by brothers Bob and Bill Healey. Located on the Bass River, Viking's 550,000-square-foot manufacturing facility features state-of-the-art machinery. Underwood-Memorial is a 305 licensed-bed, acute-care, nonprofit community hospital affiliated with the Jefferson Health System. It serves patients in Gloucester County and parts of Camden and Salem counties and has more than 1,780 full and part-time employees and a medical staff of approximately 400 physicians. The hospital owns and operates primary care family health centers in Glassboro, Mullica Hill and Paulsboro, and the Family Practice Center in Woodbury. Hospital services include comprehensive cardiac diagnostic and rehab capabilities including cardiac catheterization; deluxe maternity suites with 24-hour, in-house neonatology care; behavioral health services, including outpatient adult and children's behavioral health programs, and a modern Center for Sleep Medicine.

Underwood-Memorial continues its \$46 million campus redevelopment and enhancement initiative to increase the hospital's capacity and meet future demand for patient services. Scheduled for completion in late 2006, this initiative will allow for the enlargement of the Emergency Department by 23,000 square feet to improve patient privacy and treatment efficiency. The renovation will increase the number of patient care treatment areas from 23 to 40.

The hospital's physical medicine and rehabilitation department is being "upsized"™ to better serve an increasing ambulatory patient population. In most recent years, well over 55,000 annual patient treatments/visits were provided for physiotherapy, occupational and speech therapies with over 22 percent of these delivered on an outpatient basis.
