A CT Scan (or CAT Scan) is best suited for viewing bone injuries, diagnosing lung and chest problems, and detecting cancers. An MRI is suited for examining soft tissue in ligament and tendon injuries, spinal cord injuries, brain tumors, etc. CT scans are widely used in emergency rooms because the scan takes fewer than 5 minutes. An MRI, on the other hand, can take up to 30 minutes.

McCollister's specially trained personnel are responsible for the warehousing of disassembled units at numerous sites around the nation. At a specific time and day, when the hospital or medical center facility is ready, we deliver the unit. Our elite crews transport the unit to the site. Once on site we fully uncrate the individual pieces of the unit and place the unit and all the pieces that need to be assembled in the new room. We use special designed handling equipment to ensure the parts and pieces are placed with the ultimate care. McCollister's assists the manufacturer technicians in assembling the entire unit. Once the system is fully assembled the unit is tested and approved for use by the US FDA.
